

# 5 Things Every Website Owner Should Know

## 1. Security

Make sure your site has an SSL certificate

SSL makes all the information passed through your website encrypted

Gives you bonus points in Google search results

Action: ask your hosting provider or developer

## 2. Credentials

Keep your login and password handy for emergencies

These are: hosting, domain registrar, FTP/SFTP, and website login

Search your email for when you signed up or look at [www.whois.com/whois/](http://www.whois.com/whois/)

Action: create a note that you can find quickly in a pinch, use a password manager

## 3. Backups

You need to backup your database and your files on a daily basis

Easily restore if and when your website gets hacked

How much is one client worth? Can you afford to have your website down for a day or a week?

Action: install plugins to create daily backups or check with your hosting provider

## 4. Privacy

If you have any customers in California, you need a privacy policy

Without one you're open to litigation

See the California Online Privacy Protection Act (CalOPPA)

Action: create a privacy policy for free at [www.freeprivacypolicy.com](http://www.freeprivacypolicy.com)

## 5. Responsiveness

Mobile devices now account for nearly 2 of every 3 minutes spent online

Make sure your website is usable on smart phones and tablets

Test your site: <https://search.google.com/test/mobile-friendly>

Action: ask your developer, try a new theme or hire us!
